

What is domestic adoption?



PRIVATE AGENCIES

- Do not engage in placing DCFS wards
- Typically placing infants (occasionally slightly older children but usually not older than two years of age)
- Licensed by DCFS and may be accredited by COA



PRIVATE ATTORNEYS

- No DCFS or licensing oversight
- Coordinate connection between birth parents and adoptive parents

Search and Reunion

Search and Reunion in Illinois

- <18 yrs Only adoptive parents have access
- 18-21 yrs Adoptee can access with AP's permission
- >21 yrs Adoptee can search without restrictions
